Dear parents/caregivers,

Welcome back to our spring term. I am sure that every year the lead up to Term 4 events and Christmas gets shorter! We warmly welcomed, despite the rain, all our new families, learners and some new teachers to our Term 4 Pōwhiri. Once again our new whānau included families from all over the world including China, India, Japan, Korea, Macedonia, Middle East, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, South Africa, Sri Lanka and the United States, as well as students moving to Albany from other parts of New Zealand.

Last week we also held a very special grandparent / significant adult open morning. What a delight it was to see two and three generations interacting in classrooms. This event formed a very unique "ignite" for our Term 4 inquiry concept of Journeys. Stories were shared of ink wells and canes. The grandparents commented on how engaged the children were in their learning, "so different from when I went to school" was a common phrase shared.

At this time of year the Senior Leadership Team are beginning the process of planning next year's classes. There are a number of factors that are considered as we place students to ensure balance across all year levels.

Looking ahead to our 2024 student numbers, we are working towards placing:

- 5 Year 1 Classes
- 5 Year 2 Classes
- 11 Year 3/4 Classes
- 11 Year 5/6 Classes

We use a digital platform to support this organisation, as well as seeking student feedback regarding their peers that they are familiar with and that may have a positive connection with. In conjunction ith their class teacher they identify close friends or peers, or learner(s) that they enjoy working and being with **who do not hinder their focus on learning.**

If there are any extenuating circumstances that may require consideration (such as twins or cousins not to be in the same class) please email my PA, Lisa Elder, in confidence (email: <u>lelder@albany.school.nz</u>). If you have previously submitted a request for extenuating circumstances, we ask that you resubmit this for consideration.

We also request that you let the school office know if your child will not be returning to Albany Primary School next year or will be leaving before the end of the year (except the Year 6 2023 children who are moving onto Year 7 in 2024). Sadly it is inevitable that at the end of the year we will lose some of our amazing staff; as they can move schools, travel out of Auckland or internationally.

Thank you for your completion of the uniform survey. The information has been collated (see page 2) and does hold a few surprises. We will continue to seek feedback before any changes are introduced.

UNIFORM SURVEY RESULTS

Kia ora e te Whānau Kura Albany / Hello Albany School Whānau.

We've recently completed our uniform survey community and student feedback sections. It showed some hugely passionate thinking around our current uniform and changes people would like to see. Key messages around pricing, safety and identity were common across multiple parent and staff comments. Colour was the only contentious issue with some fantastic student suggestions that included:

- Red as a colour choice was common in 3 classes
- One class suggested the uniform needed to be fluffy and have stars on it.

The simple graphic shows an overview of the main survey outcomes. Going forward, we have identified some clear next steps. These include:

1. The sport shirt needs further exploration as a uniform option.

2. Bucket Hats were commonly requested by all stakeholders.

3. U-B-U days to be explored as a way to reward classes / teams / year levels without a charity or collection.

We hope to have more information to share with the community before the end of this year, to allow ample preparation should there be any transitional changes for 2024. e. g new hat options.

Should Albany Primary School have a uniform?	 90% of staff and community members indicated they would like Albany to continue to have a uniform. 67% of student responses (600+) would like Albany to continue to have a uniform.
What changes would you like to see being made to the school's current uniform?	 40% of community feedback wanted a different colour. Flexibility around hats, socks and footwear were common with around 20% of recipients requesting each. 33% requested that no changes be made. Bucket hats were commented on in both student and whānau surveys.
Is ecological sustainability an important consideration?	 50% of our community shared that ecological sustainability was not an immediate concern to them when buying uniform. Approximately 40% of community responses indicated cost as being the most important consideration for uniform.
Is our uniform inclusive?	• 95% of all responses felt our current uniform is inclusive of all students.
