A practical information evening presented by the teachers for Year 3/4 parents about our Better Start Literacy Approach was held on Tuesday. As a parent of a Year 3/4 student, if you missed this opportunity and would like to know more slides will be made available, or book a time to talk to your class teacher about how this programme is being implemented in the classroom.

A reminder that there is no supervision on the playgrounds after school. We are aware of a number of students that are being advised by parents to play on the playgrounds until they are collected—sometimes until/after 4.00pm. We have had a couple of accidents after school hours requiring staff to administer first aid. We do not always have staff available to offer assistance at this time. For safety reasons, please do not allow your child to play at the playgrounds unsupervised until they are collected. We have supervision at the bus bay until 3.30pm. If you are intending on collecting your child after this time then you will need to make alternative arrangements, or book them into Kelly Club.

Parents please do not park/drive into our rear carpark off Roanoke Way. This is a staff carpark only as children and parents are walking up/down the driveway before and after school.

We are excited that New Zealand Chinese Language Week is fast approaching. This will take place from Monday 23rd to Friday 27th September (Week 10 of this term). As in the past, we are looking forward to members of our Chinese community coming into the school to participate in this celebration. 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With school photographs being taken last week it has become apparent that a large number of our students are not in correct school uniform. Uniform is compulsory for all children at Albany Primary school. These are our uniform requirements:

- Yellow polo shirt (available for purchase through Argyleonline).
- Gold collar sweatshirt and/or polar fleece sweatshirt (available for purchase through Argyleonline)
- Jacket (available for purchase through Argyleonline) optional extra item.
- Sunhat MUST be worn in Terms 1 and 4 (available for purchase through Argyleonline and the school office)
- Navy coloured items must have no visible strips/logos/emblems/brands, etc and denim is not permissible—these may be purchased from any uniform provider:
 - Trackpants/Trousers
 - Leggings and shorts (minimum length mid thigh). School sports shorts may be worn.
 - Skortz and culottes (minimum length mid thigh).
- Thermals may be worn under the yellow polo shirt these must be yellow or navy.
- Socks or tights may be yellow or navy.
- Footwear should be suitable for fitness, with Velcro fasteners (or similar) if your child is still learning how to tie shoelaces.
- Jewellery is not recommended for safety reasons, ear studs, a watch or appropriate cultural / religious jewellery may be worn.
- If additional items are required to be worn for cultural or religious reasons, families are requested to inform the school. School colours yellow / navy are preferred for these items of clothing.
- Sports shirts (blue polo shirt) are not able to be worn at school these are for outside school sports only. Sports shorts may be worn as part of the school uniform.

Please note we take pride in our school uniform. The class teacher / Deputy Principals will notify parents if uniform standards are not being followed.

We ask that you ensure all children have a change of clothing in their bags (this does not have to be school uniform). This saves the office having to phone you and disrupt your day if your child requires a change of clothing.



Crunching the Numbers at ASHS



Albany Senior High School Year 11 student and AJHS alumni, Nyah Ng loves maths, and she wants to inspire younger students to share her passion. She saw Impact Projects as an opportunity to bring this idea to life.

In her first ever Impact Project, Nyah wanted to create an opportunity for Year 6 students to practise and apply their maths skills in a fun way. Her research led her to believe that many of the primary schools in the area were keen for their students to participate in maths competitions. So Nyah created



Nyah wrote all the questions and aligned them with the new maths curriculum. She developed prototype test questions which she provided to the primary schools to use as practice runs, meaning she could get an idea on the timing required for the actual competition. Looking at ways to make the competition even more of a challenge for the students, Nyah banned calculators but gave the teams a bit more time for working out. She even learned how to use the glass engraving feature on the Laser Cutter to create the prizes for the initiative.

The event was held in the Albany Senior High School theatre, where Nyah welcomed students from Albany Primary, Coatesville Primary, Greenhithe Primary, and Upper Harbour Primary, supported by a team of Year 12 and Year 13 extension maths students who acted as markers on the day. Upper Harbour Primary teams placed first and second, and an Albany Primary team came third.

After the event Nyah sent further resources to the participating schools, ensuring the maths fun could continue.
