Sadly it is inevitable that at the end of the year we will lose some of our amazing staff; as they can move schools, travel out of Auckland or internationally.

One such teacher who is leaving us is Rebecca Kerr who has been invited by Canterbury University to take the role of Facilitator Educator (Auckland area) for the Better Start Literacy Approach. Rebecca began her career at Albany Primary School as a beginning teacher in 2002 and "give or take" three parental leave breaks has remained at our school throughout this time. Over her career here she has held a variety of positions in our school, including Team Leader, Reading Recovery Tutor and this year has been the Early Years Literacy Leader, including the Better Start Literacy Approach Facilitator. In all her roles Rebecca's passion for student achievement and building strong partnerships with families has been exemplary. We wish her all the best in her new role and, fortunately for us, Albany Primary School will be "under her umbrella" so we will still have her brilliant expertise and support on our BSLA journey.
